INSPIRATIONAL MAGAZINES



Guideposts magazine stories are about personal change. Narrators face challenges in their lives that they resolve through leaning on faith and God. The challenges can cover everything from relationships to life transitions, such as caregiving, divorce, retirement or job loss, to life-threatening events. Our true stories deliver hope and inspiration with a clear spiritual point that readers can apply to everyday difficulties in their own lives. We want to be a source of spiritual well-being for our readers.

Stories should be told as first-person or third-person narratives, constructed through scenes that make the reader feel present as the story is happening. There should be a clear narrative arc. We welcome stories that are ghostwritten, with the permission of the subject. Additional points:

- Tell the story from the perspective of the person who undergoes the greatest change from the experience. Focus on one specific point in time rather than an entire life story.
- Show the specific change the narrator undergoes as a result of the experience, such as a message or insight that readers can apply to their own lives.
- Study the magazine and how stories are told.
- It's not necessary to send a complete story. A three-paragraph pitch is preferred. Explain the focus of the story, the narrative arc, how the narrator was changed and the spiritual takeaway.

Payment for stories is made when the story is accepted for publication. We publish full-length stories (1,200–1,500 words), shorter features (300–600 words) and departments. Please do not submit essays, sermons, fiction or poetry. Send pitches to <u>submissions@guideposts.org</u>.

Please follow the *Guideposts* guidelines for all magazine pitches. However, each inspirational magazine has specific thematic needs and method of submission:





Annual Editions






Each contains 365 short inspirational pieces, usually accompanied by a Bible verse and a faith step or prayer. Our daily devotions are a first-person anecdote, told in an informal, conversational style that draws the reader into the spiritual insight the writer has gained from the experience he or she describes. We endeavor to bring readers closer to God and help them live fuller, richer lives.


In addition to our annual devotional books, we also publish single-edition devotional books.

Similar to our devotional books, the bimonthly *Strength & Grace* devotional magazine contains approximately 60 short inspirational pieces focused on caregiving and inspiration for caregivers.

The challenge of writing a Guideposts devotion is to tell a compelling story, convey something of your personality to the reader and communicate an uplifting spiritual insight—all in 200 to 300 words.

For new Guideposts writers, devotionals require an audition by sending in three sample devotions. We select only a few new writers each year. Contributors write on a work-for-hire basis. Guideposts holds the copyright.



Our mystery series are generally written by a team of eight or more authors, all of whom are writing about the same characters, in the same setting. Some of our recent series include *Savannah Secrets, Mysteries of Lancaster County, Secrets of Grandma's Attic* and *Whistle Stop Café Mysteries*. Our biblical fiction, such as our popular *Extraordinary Women of the Bible* series, is meticulously researched, which brings to life people, places and stories in the Bible. And our romance fiction, including our *Love's a Mystery* series, brings readers sweet, inspirational love stories free of any graphic content.
